

School-Wide Voice Collection

School-wide Voice Collection

As part of our school-wide review and consultation process, SPC conducted a collection of voices from different groups during Term Two 2023. The collection of voices was facilitated by Cognition Education, an external provider, who interviewed parents/whanau, students, teachers and the leadership team.

We really value the time taken by those who supported us with this process. It has provided us with some key themes to focus on and consider as we plan for 2024 and beyond.

Key themes:

- There is a strong sense of belonging and community here at Saint Peter Chanel and there are positive relationships seen at all levels of the school.
- Knowing students holistically continues to be a focus (Whole Education, Whole Person) and teachers continue to learn and understand what it means to be culturally responsive to learners in their classrooms.
- Ensuring learning continues to be relevant to our students lives and providing them with a range of learning opportunities is important.
- Professional learning for staff development has been valuable, and relevant, and has encouraged collaboration and collegiality.
- Communication to whanau we have been looking into what works best for most.
- SPC has developed some key learning programmes that have supported teacher knowledge and student learning and enabled us to have a shared language and common understanding of literacy. We continue to work on sustaining these and keeping the fidelity of these programmes (staying true to their intended purpose and function).

Key Actions so far...

- Planning for more science learning opportunities a hit with students! Term 3 Inquiry focus . We also had a professional learning afternoon with Anne Barker from the University of Waikato on the teaching of science and she will be returning in 2024!
- Communication sending out the Thursday Newsletter via email to ensure that all whanau are receiving it in their email inbox and using the announcement function on our website for short-notice changes to school events.
- Professional Learning upskilling staff as coaches to sustain our Writer's Toolbox professional learning and development.
- We continue to hold high expectations for our learners and their progress and achievement we have set learning targets that teachers and learners are striving to achieve e.g., all learners can recall their times tables to 10 by Year 3 in less than 8 minutes.

School History

The Parish was established by Bishop Liston in January, 1954. The first Mass was held in the Beerescourt Hall. In that same year building began on the Church School.

Prior to the Church School being built, in 1951 Monsignor Buxton contacted Laurie Vercoe and asked him to drive him around the area to look for a suitable site for a church and school. They saw nothing suitable until they saw Frank Woodhall's house at the end of Vardon Road. 'That's the property,' said Monsignor Buxton. Frank had 7 acres of land. A bit more than was needed. Ray Corby, assistant coach for Waikato Rugby, was a land agent. Frank Woodhall wasn't too well disposed to Catholics, so Ray said he would do a bit of wrangling. Frank said he would sell the property for 7,500 pounds cash. So the purchase was completed. Frank got in terrible trouble from his friends." Oh you sold to the Catholics!" The sections on the road frontages were sold and almost covered the total cost of the property.
