The first Board of Trustees Meeting for 2024 is to be held in the staffroom on Tuesday 20th February at 7.00pm.

School Standards

The school staff endeavour to maintain high standards of behaviour and action amongst themselves and students.

We ask parents to read through our school standards of behaviour and discuss them with their children.

- 1. Students will address teachers and other adults with courtesy and respect, greeting them politely, and not interrupting adult conversation. Respect for adults will be shown at all times.
- 2. Students are expected to show care and respect for each other. Bullying behaviour is not tolerated.
- 3. Fighting (including play fighting and playing with sticks), tormenting or teasing will not be tolerated.
- 4. Students must respect the rights of others to learn in the classroom. Arrive at class on time and be prepared to apply themselves to learning.
- 5. When a student is given a duty to do, it will be completed to the best of their ability.
- 6. School and others' property must be respected. No touching other students bags, items, scooters or bikes.
- 7. No sweets at school, which includes gum.
- 8. No visiting shops, to and from school, without parental supervision. (Only exception is with Principal's permission).
- 9. The use of inappropriate language is not accepted.
- 10. Students are to hand in their phones at the Office each morning for safe-keeping.
- 11. Chromebooks must be used for learning.
- 12. Students who wish to skateboard or scooter must wear a helmet and stay in the designated areas asphalt by Rooms 5 and 12 and the skateboard ramp.
- 13. No kicking footballs or rugby balls on the courts due to close proximity to neighbouring properties.
- 14. Native bush, caretakers sheds, behind courts, and behind the library and Room 9 is out of bounds
- 15. Students will wear their full uniform to and from school.
- Hair is expected to be tidy and of natural colour. Shoulder length hair must be tied back. Any hair ties must be appropriate colour (red, green, white).
- Nail polish and make-up are not to be worn.
- The following are permitted: one pair of stud earrings, watch, cross and chain, religious medals.

Failure to keep the standards will be dealt with in a variety of ways from full discussions with students through to the withdrawal of a student from class. Detentions will be an option.

However, our emphasis is not on punishment rather, encouraging the student to accept responsibility for their actions and behaviours and exercising age-appropriate self-discipline.

Parents will be always be advised of any serious or continuing behavioural problems and will be involved in assisting the school with resolving them. If a student is sent from a classroom for misbehaviour their parents will be contacted.
