#### Rangiaowhia - Year 7 & 8 Trip

Tuesday this week, the 21st of February, marked 159 years since the atrocious battle in the thriving settlement of Rangiaowhia, located between Te Awamutu and Cambridge. In 1864, this was a thriving Maori settlement, with rich soils growing wheat and peach trees for as far as the eye could see. Both Anglican and Catholic Churches and their missionaries were present at this time. Queen Victoria received flour gifted by the Ngati Apakura people after the establishment of the first flour mill. (Hence Mill Road). The British troops invaded on Sunday 21st of February 1864, during the era of the NZ Land Wars. "Take no prisoners" instructed the commander, the peaceful people (including, children and the elderly) were massacred.

Where this bright village once was, today there is an Urupa with a powhenua that tells the tragic tale of destruction, the Anglican church (still a functioning church today), and a stone monument that shares the story of the site where so much of the devastation took place. Directly across from the church is the Hairini Hall where the British troops set up camp while the survivors of the Ngati Apakura people scattered through the wet swamp lands, making their way to safety in Otorohanga, Pirongia, Raglan, and other areas. Never to be able to return as their homes, marae, and family were gone.

Today, the area is peaceful and calm, with rolling green pastures and dairy cows stretching out to Pironga, Kakepuku, and Maungatautiri. Every year people return on the 21st of February to remember the past events and to pray for a better future. The Year 7&8 students attended yesterday's commemoration, to learn more about the Rangiaowhia story and how we can learn from it. In class today, when asked what the moral of yesterday's stories, the children said: The moral of the story is to not repeat the past, and to make the future brighter by being kinder and better towards anyone. Respectful relationships are so important. This is the sentiment shared by many of yesterday's speakers and included in prayers.

Thank you to everyone who was part of yesterday and shared so much knowledge with us.





#### **Donation Scheme**

As many of you may be aware the Government offered schools funding of \$150.00 per student for 2023, in lieu of parent donations. The Board of Trustees accepted the offer. As a result of this, our school will not be asking parents for school donations in 2023. The Government funding we receive will cover the costs of all school day trips, inter-school sports events, Year 7/8 technicraft costs, Mathletics, Write that Essay, Religious Education and performances. The funding will not cover the costs of overnight school camps, individual stationery school uniform items. Optional sports activities that happen outside of school hours such as netball, hockey, basketball, touch etc. will remain user pays. Private music lessons will also remain user pays. We are grateful for the assistance this funding provides for our students and their families. If you have any questions pleases contact the School Office.



#### Yr 7 & 8 Saints United Netball Trials

Venue: Minogue Park, 6 Moore Street, Forest Lake

Date: Saturday 11th March 2023

Time: Y7 starts @ 8am (Year 7's will trial in 6 aside format)

Y8 starts @ 10am (Year 8's will trial in 7 aside format)

Year 7 and 8 students enrolled at St Joseph's, St Peter Chanel, Marian, St Pius and St Columba's Catholic schools are invited to trial for these Saints United teams. The teams are expected to play competitive netball in a higher grade than what individual school teams can offer.

Each Saints team will have a squad of approx 9 players chosen at trials by a trio of independent selectors. The selection policy will be available at trials, and selections will be final. Players who are not selected, or who do not trial, will still play netball under the Saints United umbrella. Every Y7/8 student who wants to play netball will do so.

After trials, our individual schools will make school based teams as usual, combining our players together only if required to ensure numbers. We urge and encourage all eligible players to attend trials. Trials offer our netballers significant participation based experience and learning, and provide valuable preparation for high school netball.

All players must trial in appropriate sporting mufti. No representative netball (or other rep sport) shirts are to be worn, and hair and fingernails must be in accordance with netball rules.

Practice days, times and locations for all Saints United teams will be determined by coaching availability.

The cost per Saints United player will be \$65.00 tbc.

Each Saints team will require a coach, manager and umpire, so parents of triallists are asked to consider if/how they could offer assistance should their child be selected. The final decision on who the team's coaches and managers are is decided by the Saints United Committee.

In addition, some parental assistance with trials may be required. Please indicate at the point of registration if you can help on the day.
