Summary of the information used to develop this plan/How did you create this plan

The St Peter Chanel Catholic School Board of Trustees referenced data gathered through engagement and consultation with the many stakeholders associated with the school - teachers, support staff, students, parents, identified ethnic groups within the school, parish community, Catholic Education Office, Education Review Office, schools within our Kaahui Ako, and past students. The consultation assisted the Board to appreciate, understand and determine what is unique about our school and what should be strengthened to support our students to receive a 'whole education' and support them to become a 'whole person'.

Our consultation process in 2023 included:

- Parent survey sent to all via email to gather feedback, aspirations, desires for their children
- Staff workshops throughout the year analysing data, determining common pedagogy
- Regular student voice collected to determine teaching effectiveness and student engagement
- Whanau and Fono meetings or personal approach with Māori and Pasifika families, where they are able to share their views and wishes for their children
- Māori and Pasifika student meetings held to gain feedback for the teachers and the school
- Communications with SPC Sports Group
- Regular, specific surveys relating to current developments and/or changes conducted to gather student and parent feedback
- Bi-annual Health and Physical Education consultation.

What we heard:

- Parents said mental & emotional wellbeing is a priority for our children (2023 parent survey)
- 96% of Year 5-8 students stated that they are happy with their progress and achievement (2023 student survey)
- Many students commented on how Writer's Toolbox has supported them in improving their writing skills (2023 student survey)
- 100% of students stated they were happy, or very happy at school. Friendships, behaviours, learning experiences, how they were treated and teacher relationships were all contributors to their levels of happiness (2023 student survey)
- Students and parents valued Catholic education and values
- Students and parents value the current extra curricular activities provided, but would like the opportunity to do more of the same (many of these were student initiated and lead activities)
- Students and parents appreciated the current cultural opportunities and would like this to continue
- A desire for increased extension learning and sporting opportunities
