

The Board of Trustees held their monthly meeting on Tuesday. Business discussed included:

- Property and Maintenance work will begin shortly on the replacement of the fluorescent light fittings and aging switch boards throughout the school. The work is funded by the Diocesan Office

## Reading at Home


How much time do your children spend reading when they are away from school?

## **School History**

In 1907 a farm along Great South Road (Te Rapa Straight) was subdivided into 3 acre units and sold as small rural lots.

Land for the St Andrew's Golf Club was bought by a private citizen, Mr H.T. Gillies in 1912. The land was a wasteland of gorse, blackberry and bracken and Mr Gillies set about clearing it and developing the golf course.

The roads around the golf course were named after famous golfers - Sandwich, Vardon, Braid, and Taylor.

Mr G.W. Vercoe purchased the land for the Te Rapa racecourse in the 1920's.

A number of stables were established along Vardon Road.

The northwest part of Hamilton remained largely rural until the 1950's.
