Catholic Character Term 1

We are already in week 2 and we are off to a good start to the year. Our student Liturgy Team and our SHINE Group have been established for 2024.

Yesterday we celebrated Ash Wednesday with a liturgy lead by our senior students. As is the tradition ashes were placed on our foreheads to remind us of the importance of leading a godly life. The students were reminded that Lent is a time for almsgiving, fasting and prayer.

Classes will begin to work through the Caritas/Lent unit with teachers. This also includes Lent. Below is the general overview:

The Time is Now! Ko Tēnei tonu te Wā! Is the focus for the Caritas 2024 Lenten resources. The obvious question that follows this call for action is, "Time for what?" There are many answers to this question, and these form some of the key messages and focuses for these resources. As we focus on the three pillars of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving during Lent, we naturally connect with God and look to serve others. It is indeed time to renew our relationship with God and to consider practical ways we can be bearers of God's love to those around us. Many of the Gospel stories in this year's resources include a call to action. The Greek word for time that is used here is "Kairos," meaning opportunity to act. It is God's appointed time to act. As Pope Francis says, "Our life is made of time and time is God's gift, and it is therefore important to make use of it by performing good and fruitful actions."

In Ecclesiastes 3:1 it says, "There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens." In these resources, each of the weeks during Lent has its own sub-theme or focus, reminding us of what it is time for. In a way, these all answer the initial question: "Time for what?"

Time for Preparation Te Wā mō te Takatū

We begin in the desert with Jesus and His 40 days of preparation in the lead up to Easter. We are reminded of the importance of preparation through a Caritas story from Kiribati involving climate change and the work of Health Champions.

Time for Encounter Te Wā mō te Tūtaki

The transfiguration of Jesus in the second week and the experiences of Solomon Island instructors and students at Rural Training Centres remind us that now is the time for encounter.

Time for Justice Te Wā mō te Tika

We see Jesus overturning tables in the market in his drive for justice. The Caritas story highlights the work of the global Caritas network to bring justice after emergencies like flooding in Pakistan.

Time for Love Te Wā mō te Tūtaki

In the fourth week, Jesus explains to Nicodemus about God's love. We also meet Mana Gertrudes from Timor Leste who serves as an inspiring example of love in action.

Time for Sacrifice Te Wā mō te Whakahere

Jesus tells a crowd about His upcoming sacrifice and leaves a challenge about sacrifice and serving Him. We also meet the Phea family from Cambodia and see how their sacrifices have brought them to where they are today.

Time for Hope Te Wā mō te Tūmanako

We finish off during Holy Week with Jesus entering Jerusalem on Palm Sunday and the excitement and hope of the crowd. The final Caritas story is about Bridgith from Papua New Guinea, who reminds us about the importance of hope in our lives.


The **SHINE** (Students Helping others In Need) group is already underway. This is a large group so I am still working out the logistics of how this will work. This is a service group that works within our local community. Year 5-8 are invited to join. Last year the group gathered goods for the Refugees that come in through the Red Cross and they visited the elderly in Awatere and Alandale. Both organisations have asked for the students' support again. Also, once a term they are asked to serve morning tea to the parishioners after a Tuesday Mass.

Full School Masses continue to be every Thursday with the new time of **10:15am** and you are always welcome to attend any of these Masses with your children. Once a Term there is a school parish mass on Saturday at 5:30pm.

Later this term we will have **Solidarity Day**, a day we go without, a day we remember all those millions of people who are without food or shelter.

We hope you all have a great term and may God Bless you and give you hope and strength for all of life's challenges during 2024.




