

Traffic management - After School Pick-Up

Catholic Character Term 2

Tena koutou whanau, tamariki and kaiako in our kura and our hapori.

Term 2 is already upon us and I am back in action. Thank you to all the caring families and children who have asked how I am doing. My new hip is mending slowly but surely. I am pleased to be back to almost normal.

Firstly I would like to acknowledge those students who took part in the Eucharistic programme last term. I was told the children were fabulous and the Mass was amazing. I was so sorry that I could not be there but you were in my thoughts and prayers. 35 students received the Sacraments of Confirmation and Holy Communion. Congratulations to you all.

This term our curriculum focus is on the Holy Spirit Strand. This past week we have focused on Trinity Sunday which is a hard concept for some of the students to get their heads around. The Father, being God in heaven, The Son is part of God as Jesus who came to earth, and the Holy Spirit is part of God whom he sent us at Pentecost. These are three parts in one. As Father said at Mass last Thursday, this is a very hard concept for children and even some adults to understand.

Our Ascension/Mother's Day Mass on the Saturday of week two was so well attended. It was a beautiful Mass which I felt was uplifting and spiritual. The SHINE students helped Linda Richards and some other parishioners to make corsages for all the mothers which were beautiful and thanks to all those who helped out to make this Mass memorable.

The following Thursday we had our Pentecost Mass which we celebrated with cake for the whole school afterwards. Thanks to all those who helped. After the Sunday Pentecost Mass, there was a potluck dinner for the school and This was also very well attended by many parents, children, and parishioners. All were thrilled with the attendance, the connections made and the new relationships formed between the people of our parish and school community.

On the 7th of May, we had our group of years 5 and 6 SHINE students help out with the morning tea after 10:15 am Mass. The parishioners enjoyed mixing, mingling, and being served by our students. Our next parish, school morning tea is on the 11th of June after 10:15 Mass. This will be attended by our Year 5 and 6 SHINE students again. Parents are also more than welcome. A great chance to meet some of our senior parishioners.

On the 25th of June, some our our SHINE group will be visiting Awatere Rest Home at 9:40 am. They will talk to the residents about life experiences and hear some of their stories. They will stay and have morning tea with them and sing a few songs. The aged residents love this and it's great to see and hear some of the stories shared between our elderly and the younger generation. Please let me know if you can help out with transport. The students will be sent home with a permission slip to be signed in a couple of weeks.

Some of our staff in Years 1 - 4 are trying out the new Religious Education Curriculum. The Senior levels of the curriculum are still in the process of being written. The Junior teachers are very happy with the level of resources and also each area is very well explained for staff and students. Recently I visited the Hamilton Diocese with the two primary RE advisors for some more insight on how this new curriculum works and is put together. I was impressed with the structure and content. Learning about the new curriculum is ongoing in our school but is not yet ready for implementation in the senior school. The diocese has said that Years 5 and 6 should be ready sometime next year and the Years 7 and 8 will be completed around 2027.

The church has just moved into ordinary time on our liturgical year calendar. We have just finished the Easter season. Ordinary time will now go on till the end of November. However, there are several important feast days between now and then. This Sunday is the feast of the Body and Blood of Christ.

Some other important feast days coming up this year are:

31 May - The visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary (This feast day is where our founder Eupharise Barbier is acknowledged)

7 June - The most Sacred of Heart of Jesus

26 July - Feast of Saint Joachim and Anne (Mary's parents and Jesus' grandparents)

6 August - The Transfiguration

15 August - The Assumption of Mary into Heaven 20 October - Mission Sunday

1 November - All Saints

2 November - All Souls

24 November - Feast of Christ the King. This is the last day of our liturgical year.

1 December - 1st Sunday of Advent. This is the beginning of the new catholic church year.

On the 25th of July which is the first week back for Term 3, we are having grandparents' day. This will link to the feast day of Joachim and Anne. For those grandparents that need to travel now would be a good time to let them know. This has not been celebrated since before covid so we are looking forward to meeting our children's grandparents. If they don't have a grandparent but they have a special older support person in their lives, they are also more than welcome. Grandparents Day will commence with Mass which will be celebrated at 10:15 am. The finer details will be in a newsletter later this term.

Please encourage your children to pray each day so they grow in their relationship with Jesus. Whether it be before school, before bed, and/or at meal times. Keep warm and keep well. I wish you all a great rest of this term.


Covid
