### Old School Van

As was reported a couple of weeks ago our 1998 Toyota school van was stolen from the carpark garage. Initially, the insurers advised the van would be repaired, however, the decision has changed and the van has been written off. The school has received an insurance payment and a significant contribution from the PTFA. The intention is to replace the van as it is a vital school run-about vehicle often used to transport students to local events. THANK YOU PTFA.



### **New School Van**

As shared with the community earlier this year the school received a grant from the Grassroots Trust which is to be used towards the purchase of a brand new Toyota ZX - 10 seated Minibus. The trust have contributed approximately 50% of the purchase price. The van has been ordered and the delivery date is expected to be mid- year 2025. As a community we have some fund raising to do so we have our 50% contribution available at the time of the purchase.

Our main fundraiser involves the painting of the school. We have a few buildings due for painting and a working bee is set for Saturday 16th November 8.30 - 11.00 am. The painting group invoices the Board for the work and then donates the money back to the school to be used for the purchase of the van.




#### 2025 Enrolments


