## St Peter Chanel Feast Day

On Monday, the school celebrated St Peter Chanel's Feast Day. The students heard the story of his life at a school assembly. And yes, it is true: the SPC church has an authenticated relic: a small piece of bone from St Peter Chanel's finger.

Father Peter Chanel was the first Christian martyr of the South Pacific. Peter Chanel was born in 1803 at Clet in the diocese of Belley, France. He was the 5th child in a family of eight. He lived on a small farm two hours' walk from the nearest town. At the age of 12 he began his education under the tutelage of the local priest, Father Trompier. At the age of 16, Peter entered the diocesan Seminary. After his ordination, he found himself in a rundown country parish and completely revitalised it in the three years that he remained there. However, his mind was set on missionary work; so, in 1831, he joined the newly formed Society of Mary (Marists), which concentrated on missionary work at home and abroad. To his dismay, he was appointed to teach at the seminary at Belley and remained there for the next five years, diligently performing his duties.

In 1836, the Society was given the New Hebrides in the Pacific as a field for evange-lisation, and the jubilant Father Peter was appointed Superior of a little band of missionaries sent to proclaim the Faith to its inhabitants. On reaching their destination after an arduous ten-month journey by sailing ship, the band split up, and St. Peter went to the Island of Futuna accompanied by a lay brother and an English layman, Thomas Boog. They were at first well received by the 'pagans' and their king Niuliki, who had only recently forbidden cannibalism. However, the king's jealousy and fear were aroused when the missionaries learned the language and gained the people's confidence; he realised the adoption of the Christian Faith would lead to the abolition of some of the prerogatives he enjoyed as both high priest and sovereign. Finally, when his own son expressed a desire to be baptised, the king's hatred erupted, and he dispatched a group of his warriors to set upon Father Peter Chanel. On

On April 28, 1841, three years after his arrival, Father Peter Chanel was seized and clubbed to death by those he had come to save. And his death brought his work to completion - within five months the entire island was converted to Christianity. He was canonised as a saint in 1954, the same year our school was being built.



#### **Times Tables**

#### -- Times Tables

This term we are continuing on our mission to have all our Year 3 - 8 students learn and know the timetables. Many students can find learning their times tables challenging; it requires a high level of both patience and dedication. Parents can assist at home by teaching and coaching their children.

There are a number of positives for children in learning and knowing the timetables:

- It is a form of daily mental training that can considerably improve cognitive functions
- It enhances the ability to fully understand multiplication, have fluency, and instant recall which boosts your children's confidence in the subject
- Students become aware of the patterns of maths
- Multiplication is fundamental for enabling your child to succeed in what can
  often be considered a daunting subject
- It can also boost communication skills, improve memory and make rehearsals
  of speeches or scripts easier, help gain analytical and numerical skills

As a student becomes faster at recalling multiplications of 2 -10, they will be able to solve more complex maths in much less time.

#### Yummy stickers


