Living our School Values

At Saint Peter Chanel, we pride ourselves on fostering a community built on strong values — Love of God, love of self and others, respect, tolerance, integrity, honesty, and responsibility to name a few. These values should be the foundation of how we treat one another each day.

Recently, we've noticed an increase in **roasting** (to criticise someone severely with an intention to mock or hurt) and **name-calling** among students. While some may see this as "just joking," or a game, it's important to recognise that these behaviours can be deeply hurtful and **do not align with our school culture.** Even when intended to be funny, words can damage friendships, self-esteem, and the overall atmosphere of our classrooms and playground.

We want students to be living our school values and to be thinking carefully about the words they use and the impact they may have on others. We expect them to be accepting of others' differences, not turning them into the subject of jokes. We expect them to be upstanders, not bystanders, even when it might be unpopular. We are working on this at school; however, we need parents to continue these conversations at home.

Students who continue to 'roast' will find themselves being removed from the play-ground as a consequence and parents will be contacted. At the same time, we are working with students to understand another important lesson: we do not have to give power to unkind words. Often, students who say mean things are doing so to get a reaction. By choosing not to let these comments affect us, we take away their power. This, too, is an act of self-respect and strength. We ask you to encourage your children to respond calmly, or not at all, and tell a teacher as soon as it happens, so it can be followed up.

As parents, carers, and as a school, we share the responsibility to model and reinforce our values and expected behaviour. Please have conversations with your children about their social interactions, in and out of the classroom, and how they are living our school values every day.

On Monday 25th August the Year 5/6 students had a guest speaker from the Hamilton Catholic Diocese visit. Some students wrote about the experience.

Deacon Leon Finn, an archivist for the Hamilton Catholic Diocese, came and visited our school on Monday the 25th of August. When we walked in, we saw a very large Bible used back in the olden times. Surprisingly, he had an old book of baptism and communion names. Listening to what he spoke about, I heard lots about marriage, deaths, and baptism records. Deacon Leon Finn is an archivist who preserves the past, he said it is important to remember Catholic and family history. He showed us old vestments (priest robes) from Bishop Edward Gaines. Thank you Deacon Leon Finn for visiting.






Sausage Sizzle
